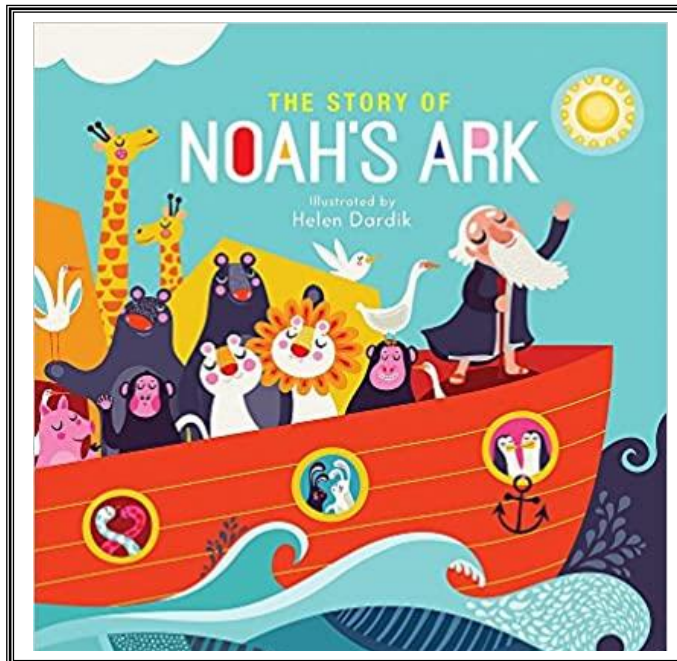
Prior/Background Knowledge:

The rainbow from the story Noah's Ark is on our school badge and is discussed often in Act of Worship.

Children know that the Bible is a holy book.

Children have explored bibles and bible stories in year 1 and 2.

They have looked at different Christian ceremonies such as baptisms.



Key questions from the children:

What the children will learn about and background information and key texts they will use:

Children will learn that:

- The Old Testament tells the story of a particular group of people, the children of Israel, known as the People of God — and their relationship with God.
- The People of God try to live in the way God wants, following his commands and worshipping him.
- They believe he promises to stay with them and Bible stories show how God keeps his promises.
- The Old Testament narrative explains that the People of God are meant to show the benefits of having a relationship with God, and to attract all other nations to worshipping God.
- Christians believe that, through Jesus, all people can become the People of God.

Key vocab and definitions:

Old testament: first part of the Bible, made up of 39 books. Happened before Jesus was born

New testament: second part of the Bible, introduces Jesus and his followers

Book: a section of the Bible

Chapter: A smaller section of the book

Verse: A couple of lines

Bible: Holy Book

Noah's Ark: A well known bible story

Command: Instruction

Covenant: A promise/pact

Symbol: A representation
