#### <u>'Unique' Raise Awareness Day: **Thursday 13**<sup>th</sup> **June 2024.**</u>

Unique is the charity supporting anyone who has a family member with a rare chromosome or single gene disorder. On Thursday 13th June 2024 it is Rare Chromosome Disorder Awareness Day (#rarechromoday). This is a day to raise awareness and increase our knowledge of rare chromosomes or single gene disorder. We will be holding a special awareness Act of Worship with the children and inviting all children to come to school in something that is unique to them or something that is either blue or yellow (the colours of the charity).
