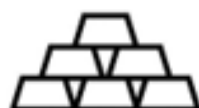


Y2 Textiles – Block A

Pupils will be able to:

- identify parts of a needle and explain the meaning of words such as *yarn* and *thread*



Prior Learning

- thread a needle independently
- use a running stitch to attach pieces of fabric

Materials:

Old clothing and fabric, paper or card for making templates, plastic 2D shapes for tracing, fabric scissors, pins, sewing needles, sewing thread, off-cuts of coloured paper, wrapping paper or greetings cards, coloured embroidery thread, cork

This block requires pupils to use: fabric scissors, sewing needles and pins. Teachers should ensure that they follow their own school's risk assessments and policies for using the necessary materials and equipment. Pupils should be taught about how to use equipment and materials safely and responsibly as part of these lessons.
